

Care & Use of Your NatureKast Cabinetry

At NatureKast, we use only the finest components and finishes available to us. The following is a guide so that you may maintain the original look of your outdoor cabinetry for many years to come.

General Care Information:

- General cleaning of cabinets, inside and out, should be done using only water (a garden hose works well).
- If necessary for greasy messes, a mild liquid dish soap such as ivory and a soft clean cloth may be used.
- We will not warranty the finish if a power washer or other high powered hose nozzle is used.
- Avoid bumping or hitting the finished surfaces, since this can produce a permanent indentation, chips or
 cuts. In the event of this type of abuse, minor surface scratches can usually be repaired depending upon
 the severity of the damage.
- Repair kits are available for all NatureKast finishes from your local dealer or paint supply store. We recommend the use of Mohawk brand touch up kits.
- PVC material (especially Black PVC) is suceptable to bleaching or warping due to direct sunlight or high heat/extreme temperature exposure. All PVC must be 100% covered before, during and after installation.
 Before and during installation, plywood or opaque white plastic cover is acceptable. Final installation cover should include resin panels and/or countertops.
- Resin material is suceptable to warping due to direct sunlight or high heat/extreme temperature exposure
 and/or gravity. All resin components (especially those painted black on the back) have a tendancy to
 warp if positioned vertically against a wall and/or other structure before and during installation.
 NatureKast recommends laying these components flat, finish side up before and during installation.
- Be aware that Resin and PVC are considered combustible materials and as such, special care must be
 taken when installing barbeques, burners, egg grills, etc. Please consult proper appliance specifications
 and installation instructions for proper clearances and other precautions (such as non combustible
 countertops, etc.).
- If you decide to have your cabinetry refinished, NatureKast recommends using a UV inhibiting top coat over any paint or stain to avoid sun bleaching. NatureKast will not be responsible for any non-factory applied finish.
- Decorative surface hardware (door pulls, knobs etc.) should be made from stainless steel, with stainless steel screws for installation for best results. Refer to manufacturer's recommendations for cleaning.

Avoid using the following products:

- Spic & Span, which contains abrasives Sodium Carbonate and Sodium Silicate.
- Tilex, which contains Sodium Hypochlorite.
- Comet, which contains abrasives Calcium Carbonate and Sodium Carbonate.
- Chlorine Bleach, which contains Sodium Hypochlorite.
- Hand Washing Liquid, which contains AlphaSulfo Methyl Ester and Sodium Laureth Sulphate.
- Glass Cleaner such as Windex, which contains Isopropanol, Alkylbenzene Sulfonic Acid Propylene GlycolMethyl Ester.
- Ammonia.
- Furniture Polish / Pledge, which contains Silicone Emulsion Waxes.

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
